

DAILY BIBLE READINGS:



These readings are related to the Lectionary readings for this Sunday. We invite you to take time each day to read the assigned Bible passage.

SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THIS WEEK:

The angel said to the women, "Don't be afraid! I know you are looking for Jesus, who was nailed to a cross. He isn't here! God has raised him to life, just as Jesus said he would."

Matthew 28:5-6 (CEV)

SAY, PRAY AND BLESS:

A Prayer for the Week:

Risen Lord Jesus, please take away our fears. Help us to go wherever you send us. Amen.

Mealtime Prayer:

Risen Lord Jesus, we praise you for the gifts of this table and our feast of Easter joy. Fill us with your love and life. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May the risen Lord Jesus replace your fears with joy, and raise you to new life with him. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION:

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Share about a time you received some good news.
- Imagine that you were one of the women who went to the tomb the first Easter morning. How do you think you would have felt?

DEVOTIONS:

When you gather for your home Easter celebrations, begin with these words (a leader says the words in *italic type*, all respond with the words in **bold type**)

*This is the day the Lord has made. **Let us rejoice and be glad in it.***

*Lord, you give us our world and all that is in it. **Alleluia!***

*Lord, you give us each other. **Alleluia!***

*We praise you God, maker of the universe, for sending us Jesus and giving us new life in him. **Alleluia!***

*Christ is risen! **Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!***

After this, hunt for Easter eggs, prepare for church, or begin your family Easter breakfast or lunch. As an afternoon activity, plant seeds or seedlings in pots or in your garden in celebration of the new life God gives us through the risen Christ.

SERVICE:

Spare a thought for those who have to work on Easter Sunday e.g. those working in hospitals, police stations or in other areas of important public service. Make up a basket of Easter "goodies" to deliver to them.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS:

As an Easter week household activity, prepare your own Paschal Candle to use during the coming year. Purchase a large white candle. Decide together on Christian symbols to place on the candle (include a cross and the year number in your design). Trace these symbols onto the candle with a felt-tip pen, and then use fabric paints to paint them on. Light the candle on the dates of church festivals and on your baptism anniversary dates.
